While Main Street in Velva may not be full of businesses for your shopping pleasure, there are plenty of local home businesses including FREEZIN USA, which is a freezedried candy business and passion for Phoebe Vollmer. "I've been making candy for years, but I found producing freeze-dried candy since 2019 to be the most interesting." she said. "There is a big difference between the two."

Phoebe, an Idaho native and her husband, Kent Vollmer, originally from Anamoose, were married and moved to Velva from Sawyer about two years ago. They needed a bigger house to allow her two granddaughters to visit and stay longer. Her husband bought her a big freeze dryer for Valentine's Day. "He's very romantic," she said. "There is just the two of us now." We had lots of garden leftovers, and he had been thinking about getting a freeze drier for years. Phoebe was thrilled and told her daughter. She then sent a bag of freeze dried Skittles from Idaho and suggested that she start making these. After doing more research Phoebe realized, "Boy oh boy, this was a crazy start! We all grew up in the 60s and 70s when Astronaut Ice Cream was a big deal," she said. "I started doing ice cream and just loved it". Phoebe considers herself the mad scientist of freeze drying.

At first started to freeze dry anything and everything she could find. When it comes to candy, she has the biggest selection because anywhere she goes candy shopping, she's looking for something interesting to add to her inventory.

You will find Freezin' USA and Color Dot Jewelry at The Big One and other local craft shows and the upcoming Festival of Trees in which she donates items for their auction. She is a big fan of the Elf Project held at the Methodist Church in Velva. "I always donate tons of candy and jewelry," she said. "It's one of my favorite causes."
