Commission Hapip presented a lengthy document about the potential harm of treating water with fluoride. Jim Kershaw, WTP Superintendent of Bismark was also present to discuss the potential harm of not treating our water with fluoride. There was much discussion on this topic.

Dockter motioned to accept the bid from FLR Sanders for \$4,071 and scheduling to be done out of the auditor's office. Weber seconded. Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Motion carried.

President Lelm gave an update on the work being done at the Memorial Building. New concrete was laid in the furnace room and storage room. A company will also be coming in to replace the winch system for the basketball hoops. This will cause the hall to be closed January 21st through the 23rd.
