City Council holds regular meeting after Board of Equalization Meeting -Clean up day - land fill to open - street repair

All members of the Glen Ullin City Council were present for the April Board of Equalization Meeting which was called to order last Monday night before the regular monthly meeting of the city council.

Morton County Assessor/Director of Tax Equalization, and Glen Ullin city assessor, Donald LaFleur was present and informed the council of how the process of assessments are completed, and when. If anyone has questions/complaints for them, please call the county assessor office.

Curt DelaBarre and Julie Kramer were present to discuss their commercial taxes. It was noted that they should make an appointment and the county officials will come out and look over their commercial building where the valuation is in question. The county will be out on April 25 to look at another house in Glen Ullin (207 4th St. South) and set up an appointment this night for them also. This means that their assessment and the other property assessment has been denied.

The council did approve the 2025 Glen Ullin Annual Assessment. If there is any difference in the two properties that the county looks at, changes, the county will adjust.

The 2025 total taxable value for residential property in the community is \$1,279,005, in 2024 it was \$1,283,648; Commercial values \$347,150 with 2024 at \$339,095; and Ag value stayed the same from last year at \$2,430.

Assessments are on a rotation of all cities in the county and next year it is Glen Ullin's turn to be reassessed.

The board of equalization meeting adjourned and the regular council meeting opened.

The consent agenda was approved and included:

-the approval of the city council meeting minutes from the regular meeting March 10 and a special meeting from March 24, 2025.

-the March financial report. -the approval of the visitor's grants

to the GUPPIE's \$2,000 for bringing the Waddington Brothers to Glen Ullin on June 27; \$1500 to Timeless Sports for advertising the Car show to be held in September; and to GUMHP LLC (Glen Ullin Motor Home Park) \$1,200 for Digital advertising for their mobile home park and apartment building.

-approval of Resolution 2025-1 adopting Local Emergency Operain Glen Ullin had one bid submitted. It was submitted by Jeromy Kuntz for \$100. The council approved the purchase and he will have to pay for the title transfer.

There was only one bid submitted for the tear down of the burnt house (deemed a dangerous property) at 112 B Street South in Glen Ullin. The bid was from Glasser Excavating, Inc. (Gary Glasser) in the amount of \$10,000. The council approved and the tear down can only begin 30 days from the approved bid, May 14, 2025.

Randy Wehri gave an update on the maintenance department for the city. He had received a couple estimates for asphalting and chip sealing some streets. More information should be gathered as the city has a more accurate amount to be done. The council approved \$95,000 to be used to chip seal streets, with funds taken from the sales tax account. The mayor and Wehri will get a more exact number of streets to be done for that money.

The lagoons have been flushed and levels good. Manhole flushing will begin.

All city equipment is operational. The city will check into Pro Link

which gives rewards for purchases. Morton County Deputy Gartner

was present at the city council meeting. He was instructed to watch for semi's parking on the south side of South Avenue. There are signs posted to park only on the north side of South Avenue. Scooters were discussed briefly with nice weather there will be more out. He was asked to suggest to the school resource officer if he could give a presentation on scooter safety and other safety on the streets as the weather gets nicer and more bicycles and electric motorized vehicles will be out and about.

The landfill will be open beginning Saturday, April 26 from 9:00am to 12 noon. The regular hours will continue weather permitting. Wednesday's 5:30-7:00 pm and Saturday's 9:00am to 12 noon.

It was also noted that the Chester Miller Clean-up Day will be May 21 and May 22, 2025. This is a time for the citizens of Glen Ullin to clean up those property's. Once again you can put your unwanted "stuff" on the boulevard and the city crew will be picking it up from there and take to the inert landfill. This hasn't been done for number of years but this year the city crew will pickup curb side. All items including branches will be picked up curbside. Branches must be in 4 foot lengths, not the whole tree. A limit of 2 large items and 4 small items are allowed curbside. All inert landfill rules and charges apply. Absolutely no household wastes

Wehri will also look at hooking up the lift station monitoring system which was approved by the council, a Sensaphone 400 autodialer for \$400..

Junk car removal from properties was discussed. The ordinance says any cars that are not working or licensed must be removed or covered. The city will talk to the city lawyer Olivia Krebs and see how the ordinance plays out legally. There are many areas where there is old cars parked on property or boulevards that do not run. Junk yards was also discussed. The city will look at ways to get things cleaned up.

On April 24 Moore Engineering will be around town stopping at the homes where the property owner has not submitted the water survey, which has to be done by all residents. Staff from Moore Engineering will be going door to door to get the residents to complete this survey. All they want to know is what kind of water lines does your home have. If you want you can complete the survey on your own by visiting www.ndwaterpipes.com and complete the online survey which takes approximately 5 minutes to complete. If you prefer not to complete the survey online the staff from Moore Engineering will help you out when they stop by. So please let them in to help or get it done online.

Aaron Kottre will again be summer help for the city.

The police report submitted for March included 2 traffic citation, 4 traffic warnings, 50 general police calls, 1 alarm, 5 medical assists, 15 court papers served.

The next regular scheduled city council meeting is for Monday, May 12, 2025 at 6:30pm.


