

## Blue Jays, Roelfsema double up Dickinson

Valley City's Parker Roelfsema scored two goals and Jamestown scored three in a span of 2:35 in the first period on the way to a 6-3 win over Dickinson in Western Dakota Association Boy's hockey at John L. Wilson Arena.

Jacoby Traut got the Jays on the board first with an unassisted goal at the 9:04 mark of the first period. Jackson Maddock made it 2-0 Jays with an even strength goal 1:17 later. John Belzer and Max Whitman assisted on the goal. Parker Roelfsema made it 3-0 at the 11:39 mark with assists from Nate Walz and Jackson Maddock.

Jamestown added two more goals in the second period. With a delayed penalty being called, John Belzer scored to make it 4-0 at the 11:29 mark of the second period. Gabe Halko and Braxton Burkett got the assists. Three minutes later,

with the man advantage, Bennett Goehner scored a power play goal assisted by Walz and Maddock to make it 5-0 Blue Jays with 2:31 remaining in the second period.

Jamestown's Max Whitman was called for roughing at the end of the second period giving Dickinson a power play to start the third. Shayden Jackson

scored 46 seconds into the period to get the Midgets on the board.

Roelfsema scored his second goal of the game 31 seconds later to make it 6-1 Jamestown.

Dickinson would score two more goals to make the final 6-3. Roelfsema had two goals for Jamestown. Jackson Maddock and a goal and three assists.

Nate Walz had three helpers. John Belzer had a goal and an assist. Bennet Goehner and Jacoby Traut each had a goal. Max Whitman, Gabe Halko each had an assist. Cooper Kirkeby made 20 saves for Jamestown.

The Blue Jays, who have won five of their last seven games, are now 9-4-1-1 and in third place in the

## Hi-Liners open Region 1 play with road win

Valley City used a 22-8 run in the span of 9:14 over the third and fourth quarters to take control of the game on the way to a 75-68 win over Fargo Oak Grove in Region 1 boys basketball at Oak Grove High School.

The game had nine lead changes and four ties, six of those lead changes came in the first quarter when the biggest lead for Valley City was two points (15-13) and the biggest lead for Oak Grove was four (6-2).

The Hi-Liners tied the game at 6 on a basket by Finn Dockter with 5:07 to go in the quarter. A three-pointer by Aidan Saunders gave the Groves the lead back at 9-6, six seconds later. The

Hi-Liners came right down and tied it at 9-9 on a Miken Mattson three-pointer with 4:48 to go. Twenty seconds later, Oak Grove went back up on top on a Noah Meidinger basket underneath to go up 11-9. That's when a game of leap frog broke out. There were six lead changes over the next six made field goals. The last lead change came on jumper from the elbow from Kai Zabel to put Oak Grove back up 18-17 with 37.8 seconds to go in the first quarter.

Over the first 3:40 of the second quarter, the Grovers would out score Valley City 13-7 to take a seven point lead, their biggest of the game. After a Bryson Heck three-pointer from the corner tied the game at 22-22 with 5:29 to go in the quarter, Oak

Grove went on a 9-2 run to take the seven point lead. A three-pointer from Carter Wendelbo made it 31-24 with 4:20 remaining in the second. Zabel would grab a loose ball at half court and race in for the lay up to make it 33-26 Oak Grove with 3:43 to go in the quarter. Another Wendelbo three-pointer would make it 38-31 Grovers with 2:17 to go in the quarter. That is when Valley City began to chip away. The Hi-Liners end the quarter on a 7-3 run, including a Andrew Sykora three-pointer and a Teagan Zaun free throw to make it 42-40 Oak Grove at halftime.

The first half of the third quarter would see Valley City take the lead on the seventh lead change on a Jack Dieterle basket off an

inbound to make it 47-45 with 6:38 to go in the third. Then the eighth lead came when Karter Koenig hit a three-pointer to make it 48-47 Oak Grove with 5:16 to go in the third. Valley City would go on its game deciding run, beginning with the next eight points to regain the lead for good. The final lead change came on a Dieterle basket inside, making it 55-53 Hi-Liners with 1:44 to go in the third. The Grovers would tie it at 55-55 on a William Olson scoop shot inside 30 seconds later. Heck's free throw with 45 seconds to go in the third gave Valley City the lead for good.

Valley City started the fourth quarter on an 11-4 run, with five of the points coming at the free throw line. In the final quarter,

Valley City was nine of twelve at the charity stripe to help put the game away. Mattson and Dockter combined to go four for four at the line in the final 24 seconds to put the game on ice.

Mattson led Valley City with 21 points. He added four rebounds and three assists. Bryson Heck had 18 points, 14 rebounds and six assists. Jack Dieterle added 18 points, and 14 rebounds. Finn Dockter had twelve points and four assists. Andrew Sykora had five points and Teagan Zaun had a point and four rebounds.

The Hi-Liners are now 6-2 overall and 1-0 in Region 1. They host #3 Killdeer and #7 Beulah this weekend at the Hi-Liner Activity Center.
