Meeting was called to order at 10:01 am CST with all members present: Chairman Larry Silbernagel presiding.

#1) MOTION BY: Commissioner Comeau and SECONDED BY: Commissioner Snider

To approve April 9, 2024 regular meeting agenda.

ROLL CALL: Commissioner Snider- Aye Commissioner Silbernagel-Aye Commissioner Comeau-Aye Motion Carried. Yes-3 No-0

Commissioner Silbernagel recommends to dispense of the meeting minutes until the end of the meeting.

Toby Gross elder brother of Rick Gross had a discussion regarding the property as well as the section line, Toby provided a map to the commissioners regarding the said road as well as the section line that was in discussion prior to having this road moved. Christopher Redmann, Sioux County State's attorney recommends that the county should leave the section line alone, Steve Snider stated that they do not maintain this road also. If it is not a section line, and if it is not a road that they maintain then it is recommended that the commissioners rescind their motion.

City of Selfridge, Bergetta Ternes - Bergetta is requesting for maintenance on city roads regarding the city of Selfridge. Bergetta states that the city is aware that there will be a charge to the city for the services.

To approve the road request for the city of Selfridge.

Bergetta has a personal request from the county regarding the gravel on her road, Steve Snider stated that we have another gravel pit that has grade 13 gravel in it. It was also brought to the commissioner's attention regarding the loop road. Commissioners Snider recommends that if they can buy gravel now, they should as the gravel will be hard to purchase in the future as others will be needing gravel as well. Continued discussion regarding gravel for the roads.

Weed Board, Victor Kraft - He stated that he brought over bills, and he also asked about someone taking his position on the weed board. Angela Eagle, asked the commissioners if they would like to advertise the position, commissioner Silbernagel and commissioner Snider recommends to add the cedar soil and the roads department into the job description.

Michael Crow Feather, Sheriff: no report at this time.  
Jodie and Maxine Thunder Hawk - Concerns regarding

Sheriff Michael Crow Feather and an accident is the issue of having the issue to track down the report, states that the report was given to the state's attorney for review of the charges. Commissioner Snider states that sheriff Michael Crow Feather should have reports available to the citizens. Chris Redmann stated that the reports can be completed by the BIA police because they too are cross deputized. Jodie was requesting for the clarification on the process of obtaining a report from the sheriff.

Commissioner Silbernagel is requesting for Sheriff Crow Feather to have a public home phone number in the phone book as a lot of people have been inquiring about this due to not being able to get ahold of him. It is recommended that the county is to pay for a phone number so that he is available

Auditor, Angela Eagle - provided an update regarding the meeting that was held with Standing Rock Sioux Tribe. The sum of the meeting was that the ND state highway are looking to do an agreement with Standing Rock, that will include specific information. The agreement will be solely between the tribe and the state. Angela stated that as of today there hasn't been any updates on the agreement yet.

Roads Department-Steve Snider- gave an update on the roads that have been worked on, Steve also stated that he has a picture for the wired fence that is crossing a road.

Commissioner Snider recommends that the drivers/operators should have their physicals be done with Sanford occupational, it is recommended by Angela Eagle to update this in the handbook. Discussion regarding the part time truck driver, advertise for the position.

Sue stated that her sidebar grant is expiring at the end of July and she is purchasing a welding stimulator to utilize with the kids. Commissioners thank Sue for her continued assistance for the schools and for her hard work.
