

# International Peace Garden: History of the Border

The International Peace Garden celebrates the longest unfortified border in the world, stretching 5,525 miles between the US and Canada. The border's current location is the result of centuries of treaties, adjustments, disputes and negotiated agreements between the US and Great Britain and, in later years, the Dominion of Canada.

After the Revolutionary War, the 1783 Treaty of Paris set the border from the northwest angle of Nova Scotia to the head of the Connecticut River, then down the river to 45th parallel, which was the dividing line west as far as the US extended at that time. In 1803 following the Louisiana Purchase, the watershed between the Hudson Bay and the Mississippi and Missouri rivers was originally used as the northern border of the huge new territory added to the US. In 1818, a straight line across the 49th parallel was established as the border from Lake of the Woods in the east to the Rocky Mountains in the west.


A campaign to push the border north of the 54th parallel helped propel James Polk to the presidency in 1844 with the slogan "fifty-four forty or fight." The US claimed land extending north to the southern border of the Russian territory of

Alaska, while Great Britain claimed land extending south to the Columbia River. Rather than go to war over the territory, the two nations turned to diplomacy. The dispute was settled in 1846 when the US and Great Britain signed the Oregon Treaty, which established the border at the 49th parallel from the Rocky Mountains to the west coast. On July 1, 1867, the British North America Act established the newly independent Dominion of Canada. The US and Canada continued to work together to survey and mark their common border from the east coast to the west.


A joint International Boundary Commission was established in 1908 to survey the border, and in 1925 the commission was made permanent to maintain border lands and monuments. Today the commission maintains more than 8,000 monuments and 1,000 survey control sites along the border.

The McIntosh County Board of Commissioners are accepting bids to gravel certain roads in McIntosh County as follows:

Site 1: 91st St. – 7 miles graveling - starting from Dickey County Line.

Site 2: 85th St. – 10 miles of graveling from Co. Hwy #9 west to Co. Hwy #23. Gravel will come from Allen Entzi pit.

Site 3: 88th St. – 13 miles of graveling from State Hwy #3 west to Co. Hwy #55

Site 4: 91st St. – 10 miles of graveling from State Hwy #3 west to Co. Hwy #35

Price should include mobilization, hauling/spreading with belly dump at 25 ton/load, 2" of loose gravel/mile

We will not be billing insurance and payment is due at time of service. There will be no add-on lab tests available, if you are due for other labs for your provider you will need to do this at a separate date.

Your lab results will be mailed to you, and if you have any questions about your results you will need to schedule an appointment with your provider to discuss your results.

If you have Medicare as your primary insurance, and have a payable diagnosis (high blood pressure, high cholesterol), Medicare will pay for these lab tests in full so this would not be beneficial for you to do.
