Accepting Grant Applications

Cavalier, ND – The deadline to apply for a Cavalier Community Foundation (CCF) grant is April 30, 2025. Applications are available online at www.ndcf.net/cavalier. Applications must be completed online by April 30th.

Eligible applicants include any organization holding a current 501(c)3 tax status from the IRS as well as schools, park districts and organizations with a formal government relationship. Grants shall be awarded to organizations and projects that benefit the citizens and visitors of Cavalier.

The CCF focuses on projects that have broad community support. The impact a grant would make to a project is also a consideration. Funding will not be awarded for daily operations.

Grants to the Cavalier community are made possible through contributions from donors who want to make a difference in the community.
