A regular meeting of the Carrington School District #49 School Board was held on February 11, 2025, at 4:00 PM. in the high school library. Present: Angela Kutz, Dr. Ben Garr, Joey Irmen, and Joel Lemer. Absent: Tonia Erickson. Kimary Edland recorded the minutes.

President Lemer called the meeting to order at 4:00 PM and declared a quorum present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. By consensus the following were added to the Agenda: Superintendent evaluation and Policy F500.

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NOTICE NOT TO ENCROACH/OBSTRUCT **COUNTY ROADWAY Foster County Board of Commissioners**

It has been noticed that prior farming operations have been conducted upon various lands within Foster County where the view of a roadway or intersection may have been obstructed by rocks, fences, or crops that have been placed or were allowed to grow within the rights of way of county roads. The landowner or tenant could be held liable for damages arising from an accident occurring within the obstructed roadway.

In following North Dakota Century Code Section 24-05-03, the Board of Foster County Commissioners intends to send out notices to landowners who encroach upon the rights of way of county highways (roads). Any landowner who receives this notice shall have twenty days to remedy the damages of the encroachment. If the landowner fails to properly remedy the encroachment, the landowner will be liable to the county for damages resulting in the county's remedy of the encroachment. Each landowner who fails to correct the encroachment on their own will be invoiced for actual costs incurred by the county to remedy the encroachment. If the landowner fails to pay for the costs, those costs shall become a part of the taxes to be levied against the land for the ensuing year and shall be collected in the same manner as other real estate taxes are collected.

Please take notice, when doing any planting or fieldwork, you are urged to read, follow and respect NDCC 24-05-03 which prohibits the planting/seeding of any crops or to allow any obstructions to be placed within county and township road rights of way. County road rights of way are defined as being at a location which is 33 feet from the centerline of any county road with a 3 to 1 inslope (foreslope) ratio, while farm to market road rights of way may extend up to 75 feet from the centerline of the roadway. Right of way violations on federal aid roadways could jeopardize federal funding needed to maintain these roadways.

Right of way widths vary within the county. Please contact Foster County officials for information to verify compliance
