Public Works Superintendent Hirschert reported that Well #1 at the Water Treatment Plant will be serviced at the end of April and will be out of commission for 2-3 weeks. Fleming informed the commission that he helped Water Plant Manager Ian Coenen to troubleshoot the cash acceptor at the water plant.

Public Works Superintendent Hirschert presented his report. Free Dumps and curbside clean-up have been set. Hirschert has compiled a list of curb stops that don't work or are damaged. Junk yard list has completed, and the vehicle list is in process. Fleming made a motion to accept the report. Dauenhauer seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

City Auditor Presnell presented his report. The Tier II reporting has been submitted to the ND Department of Emergency Services. Backflow prevention report has been submitted. Double M Sanitation reached out about being interested as an option for garbage service. Presnell reported that the City received additional funds from the state from the Municipal Infrastructure Fund. Presnell recommended places \$200,000 into a CD. Richter made a motion to place \$200,000 in Municipal Infrastructure Funds into a 9-month CD at the Community Credit Union at 3.90%. Dauenhauer seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Fleming made a motion to approve the housing incentive for Ashley Weixel. Dauenhauer seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Fleming made a motion to approve gaming permits for New Rockford Dollars for Scholars, New Rockford Park District, Dakota State Eagles, NRABC, Eddy County 4-H. Richter seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Richter made a motion to approve the building permits for Brick & Beam, Joe Volk, Mike & Carol Risovi, and Joshua Bruggman. Fleming seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Fleming made a motion to approve the special event permit

for Buck-its Bar. Richter seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Richter made a motion to declare 815 4th Ave N and 608 Central Ave as a substandard structure and send them out for preemptive bids. Dauenhauer seconded the motion. All were in favor.
