Mor-Gran-Sou Electric awards scholarships

Annually, Mor-Gran-Sou Electric Cooperative fuels the future by awarding scholarships to high school seniors within its service area.

This initiative embodies the cooperative's unwavering commitment to community growth and celebrates the achievements of local students. By recognizing these students' outstanding accomplishments, Mor-Gran-Sou Electric honors students' drive, resilience and passion for their future.

This year, Mor-Gran-Sou Electric awarded 10 scholarships. Eight of those were given on behalf of Mor-Gran-Sou Electric to area seniors, while two were in partnership with Basin Electric Power Cooperative and West Dakota Utility Services (WDUS). Mor-Gran-Sou Electric is fortunate to have partners who also invest in the future of the cooperative.

The Mor-Gran-Sou Electric recipient of the \$1,000 Basin Electric/Mor-Gran-Sou Electric scholarship is Raymond Holle, New Salem. He plans to attend the University of North Dakota in pursuit of a degree in biology.

A \$500 scholarship was available on behalf of WDUS to applicants who plan to attend a certified vocational or technical school. Case Roethlisberger of Huff was awarded the WDUS scholarship. He plans to attend North Dakota State College of Science in pursuit of a degree in diesel technology.

and/or philanthropy. This award recognizes an individual's dedication and achievements throughout his/her lifetime.

Christy Dauer's lifelong passion for service began at just six years old and has since fueled her deep and lasting impact on North Dakota's nonprofit community. A driving force behind the North Dakota Women's Business Center (NDWBC) as their executive director, Christy has expanded programming, boosted engagement, and led the organization to record participation in coaching and training opportunities. By doing so, she has helped empower countless women to launch and grow businesses. She is also the co-founder of Power of 100, a giving initiative that has grown across

the state and beyond, inspiring a culture of grassroots philanthropy. Christy's leadership extends to some of the most marginalized communities, including her transformative work in incarcerated programming that supports second chances and pathways to economic stability.
