PASTOR'S NOTES

Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus

We have been considering Colossians 3:5: "Therefore put to death your members which are on the earth: fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry." We saw that the main idea here is that those who have been born again and made new creatures in Christ should be seeking to become experientially what we are in Christ.

Today we come to some specific sins that the believer is to "put to death": "fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry." These are sins which should have no place in the life of a Christian. Rather they characterize unbelievers who have nothing but the sinful nature with which to function. This particular list moves from outward sins of immorality to inward cravings of the heart.

Fornication, which repeatedly shows up

as a sin which is incompatible with being a Christian, is mentioned first. The word carries several shades of meaning in the New Testament, all related to sexual uncleanness. It can refer to sex outside of marriage or to sex with anyone other than a person's spouse (also called adultery). It can also mean any kind of illegitimate sexual activity, such as prostitution, incest, homosexuality, or bestiality. In a Christian, fornication is particularly heinous because he or she is joined to Christ and indwelt by the Holy Spirit. We read in 1 Corinthians 6:15, "Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take away the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? May it never be!" Then in verses 19-20: "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and

that you are not your own? For you have been bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body."

Uncleanness refers to impurity or moral corruption. This too is a sin which is referred to elsewhere as having no place in a Christian's life. We read in 1 Thessalonians 4:7, "For God did not call us to uncleanness, but in holiness." Christian men, this may not be a problem that any of us has presently, but it is wise for each of us to pray for himself and for one another, that God will keep us faithful to our wives. Years ago a well-known Bible teacher declared that he knew he would never be unfaithful to his wife. Within a year he had fallen into that very sin, as have so many others. May God give each of us grace to love his wife as Christ loved the church and gave Himself for her.

Passion was used by Stoics to describe a person who was dominated by emotions rather than rational thought. In the New Testament it generally means lack of self-control, leading

to fulfilling shameful desires. We read of this in 1 Thessalonians 4:3-5: "For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you should abstain from sexual immorality; that each of you should know how to possess his own vessel in sanctification and honor, not in passion of lust, like the Gentiles who do not know God."

Lord willing, we shall continue with the list of sins to be put off next time. In closing, let me remind us that putting away sin requires the enabling grace of the Holy Spirit. Personal strength and determination are not enough. If you are a believer in the Lord Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit lives inside you and can help you. But if you are not a believer, not only are you without such support, but you will also be separated from God eternally if you die in unbelief. Please be sure that you are trusting in the Lord Jesus Christ—and Him alone—to make you right with God. It matters both now and forever.

Recipe: Amish Potato Salad

From the kitchen of: Joy Zimmerman

Ingredients:

- 8 medium to large potatoes
- about 7 cups cooked and diced
- 6 hard boiled eggs, diced
- 3/4 C. dill or sweet pickles, chopped
- 1/2 C. celery, chopped
- 1 small onion, peeled and finely chopped

Dressing:

- 1 + 1/2 C. Miracle Whip dressing
- 1/2 to 1 Tbsp. white sugar
- 2 Tbsp. white vinegar
- 2 Tbsp. pickle juice
- 1 Tbsp. milk or cream
- 2 tsp. prepared mustard
- 1/2 tsp. paprika

Directions:

Boil the potatoes until fork-tender; cool and peel. Mix all the dressing ingredients in a small bowl - taste to see if you want to add more sugar and set aside. In a large bowl, put in the other ingredients and pour on dressing and chill. Stir before serving. Note: I always saw creamy potato salad topped with hard boiled eggs and then sprinkled with paprika. But this recipe calls for the paprika in the dressing!
