City Council Monthly Meeting
Monday May 5th, 2025
Napoleon City Hall 7:30 p.m.
(Subject to council review and approval)

Mayor Moos called the regular meeting to order. Alderman present: Rod Kleppe, Mike Heying, Clark Haas, Bob Humann, John Wald, and Rich Bjerklie.
Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Wald motioned to approve the minutes from April 7th, 2025, meeting, Heying seconded, motion carried. Kleppe motioned to approve the minutes from the Board of Equalization meeting, Wald seconded, motion carried. Heying motioned to approve the minutes from the Floodplains public hearing, Humann seconded, motion carried.

Kleppe motioned to approve the financial report, Bjerklie seconded, motion carried.

Grant Dockter from Moore Engineering gave the Engineer's Report. Completed projects are the 2021 Water System Improvements, Sanitary Sewer Improvements, and the 2023 Water System Improvements. Dockter asked for an approval for a resolution for levying special assessments for the 2023 Water System Improvements project. Kleppe motioned to approve the resolution, Humann seconded, all hands raised in favor, motion passed. Notice and certification will be done then a public hearing will be held on June 5th. The specials will be held at City Hall and only enforced if payments cannot be made by the city. Moore Engineering is doing the platting for the Gross's where they are building on the lots up by Wentz Living Center. Dockter was asking for approval on the preliminary plat map. Kleppe made a motion to approve, Bjerklie seconded, all hands raised in favor, motion carried.

Humann motioned to pay all bills as presented, Heying seconded, motion carried.

CITY SALES TAX REQUESTS: A request was received for a \$20,000 grant for help in the construction of a new clubhouse at the Napoleon Golf Course from the Economic Development Fund. Humann motioned to approve the grant, Wald seconded, motion carried. The grant was approved also by the City Sales Tax Committee.

ZONING PERMITS: Mary Humann-garden boxes; Jamison Fettig-curbing and sprinklers; Malai Grenz-garden shed; Jordan Dewald-remove bushes; Danielle Price-new windows, fence; Keith McCleary-move shed onto property; Christina Gross-temporary greenhouse; Mike Heying-privacy fence along driveway; Dave Givan-replace skirting, snow guard rail on roof, add small rocks around house inside curbing; Colleen Fettig-remove bushes; Pat Becker-level backyard, pour cement, put up metal building. Bjerklie motioned to approve all the building permits as presented, Haas seconded, motion carried.

Kleppe motioned to purchase the extended warranty on the garbage truck for \$4540 for another three years, Bjerklie seconded, all hands raised in favor, motion carried.

Mayor Moos asked the council if they all had a chance to drive by the lights put up by MDU last fall and if they felt any changes were needed. Wald motioned that lights were all OK and no changes needed, Kleppe seconded, motion carried. Discussion was had on adding one by John Wald's residence since it was removed when the street project was done there and was not put back up. MDU will be contacted to see if a light could be put back up on that street.

City Hall will be closed on Monday, May 26th for Memorial Day. Garbage pickup will be on Tuesday, May 27th.
