they have no problem with the Country Club using the tax ID number of the Napoleon Park Board.

Grant Dockter with Moore Engineering was on hand to give the engineer's report. He gave an update on completed projects and said special assessments have been established for the 2023, 3rd Street water project. He noted a hearing will be held on Thursday, June 5 regarding the special assessments. The council then was directed to approve the resolution to levy special assessments, with a unanimous vote for the resolution. The meeting will be held at the city hall and the specials will only be enforced if payments cannot be made by the city.

He gave an update on the 4th Street West water extension project and said they will start to mill the road on May 12 and underground work is set to begin May 19.

Dockter gave a report on the new housing development for Grosses, in southeast Napoleon, as the engineering firm is doing the platting. He said the council should decide if the roadway should be a private or public roadway, and if it's a public roadway, the city needs to keep up with maintenance and snow maintenance. He also spoke about water for the development and renaming the subdivision. The council agreed the road should be a private roadway and gave their approval on the preliminary plat map that was proposed.

Dockter said they've been seeing and filling in dirt work on the pedestrian trail and that is almost finished. Humann also said he'd like to order about four garbage cans and a pet cleanup station, so pedestrian path users can throw away trash and also cleanup after their pets.

Wald said residents should have their garbage cans set in the alleyways from now on, as the city employee's will be pick up garbage from the alleys on the designated days. The council also said there are several 95-gallon garbage cans left and they are still up for purchase for residents.

Bjerklie said the fence is done and has been placed around the lagoon and looks good.

Kleppe noted a few residents' water had to be turned off due to being delinquent. He said the two city office employees received abuse and were not treated right by some residents and it's unacceptable. The council agreed that the employees need to be treated with respect and shouldn't feel threatened like that, but they said they have to stay consistent with the ordinance and delinquent city bills. Kleppe noted a lot have paid but two accounts are still not cur-

Last month the council spoke with property owner Kelly Repnow about his lots in town and he questioned rezoning. After the council asked what he would do with the lots, he said he didn't have any plans at that time. This month Repnow is wondering about changing a lot to commercial from residential, but didn't specify what the lot would be used for. The council noted the property needs to be at least two acres of land to be zoned commercial. Since the lot is not two acres, the council agreed to table the request because Repnow needs the correct acreage and a plan.

Approved zoning permits include: Mary Humann-garden boxes; Jamison Fettig-curbing and sprinklers; Malai Grenzgarden shed; Jordan Dewaldremove bushes; Danielle Pricenew windows, fence; Keith McCleary-move shed onto property; Christina Gross-temporary greenhouse; Mike Heyingprivacy fence along driveway; Dave Givan-replace skirting, snow guard rail on roof, add small rocks around house inside curbing; Colleen Fettig-remove bushes; Pat Becker-level backyard, pour cement, put up metal building.

Heying went over the plan for the city-wide cleanup day he planned, which was May 10. He said some FFA kids are planning to help and the city will donate \$500 to the Napoleon FFA organization.

Mayor Moos gave a couple options for the garbage truck warranty. After discussion the council approve for Moos to go with the best plan that he suggested, which was for three years at \$4,540.

The council discussed construction rates for garbage pick up, as this needs to be billed differently than regular garbage, since there is considerably more garbage when construction projects are being done. The council said the construction garbage costs are usually billed to the contractor and they should stick with that.

The next regular meeting is scheduled for Monday, June 2 at 7:30 pm.
