

1925 100 years ago Sanborn teacher drowns while at Chautaugua Park

Miss Florence Bennett, 20 of Lidgerwood, N. Dakota., lost her life by drowning in the Sheyenne river at Chautauqua Park shortly after two o'clock this afternoon. Miss Bennett, a teacher at Sanborn, was here with other teachers and pupils of the school, who gathered at the park today to enjoy a school picnic. Miss Clara Gottenberg, another teacher, and Miss Elizabeth Malm, 19, entered the river at the boy's swimming hole and, finding it too deep there, entered at a more shallow place. Miss Gottenberg at

first was seized with cramps and Miss Bennett is said to have gone to her rescue. Both girls were out beyond a wire fencing in the river. Miss Malm

succeeded in reaching shore and Walter Hoster, Jr., of Valley City, bathing nearby, jumped into the water and saved Miss Gottenberg, but was not aware at the time that Miss Bennett was under. Word was immediately sent to the city and officers hurried to the scene. A boat occupied by Deputy Sheriff Fred King and Patrolman Willie Murphy was launched and within a few minutes their grappling hook caught onto the girl's bathing suit.
