He commented on the early-outs and that the Fort Ransom teachers have been putting on Commu-nity Outreach events to pull the students and community members together on those dates. Previously held events have had very positive outcomes. Parent/Teacher Conferences are coming up on March 19th and 20th from 3:30-6:30. He also mentioned that End of the Quar-ter/Year testing will take place with the NDA+ assessment system. Math Olympics will be on May 2nd, and teacher evaluations are due by April 15th.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT: – We have been focused on planning for the Public Hearing, financial matters, and preparing for Fort Ran-som's future. Attached are Three Pathways to the Future and Financial Presentation drafts. Issues with fuel, bus windshield, and a heating unit during the cold snap have been resolved. CJIS training is being completed. We opted out of participation in Lisbon's early outs and kept our students in school. Elizabeth, Leila, and I participated in the SE Professional Development activity via Zoom on January 20, 2025. Fire drills and lockdown exercises are up to date. I continue to provide weekly Legislative Updates. As a member of the NREA Executive Board, I will lobby for rural schools in Washington, D.C. from April 6-9, 2025, and attend the NREA Winter Retreat in Kearney, NE. We are concerned about federal funding freezes and cuts to Secure Rural Schools, REAP, IDEA, and Section 504 support. UNFINISHED BUSINESS: NDIRF will increase our premium when our policy renews to con-sider the increased values from the Valuations Northwest inventory taken last fall. NEW BUSINESS: Issue Teacher Contracts – Jon met with the teachers about contract renewals/concerns. Mrs. Elizabeth Kruger informed the school board during our meeting that she received a teaching contract with another school and will be taking that opportunity. After discussion, Chelsey moved to issue Leila Mark a contract with a 3.5% increase to her base, making her new base \$67,255.80. Samantha seconded the motion.
