RANSOM COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING JULY 15, 2025

The meeting was called to order by Chair Greg Schwab at 9:00 a.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Members present: Todd Anderson, Neil Olerud, Sye Olson, Kevin Bishop, and Greg Schwab. Also present: Auditor Nicole Gentzkow and Lynn Kaspari with the Ransom County Gazette.

Agenda was reviewed. Anderson added a couple items Qual Road, lockers for the courtroom, banking, and fuel tanks. Anderson moved, seconded by Olson to approve the agenda with additions. All

aye. Motion carried.
Sandy Hoff with City of Lisbon council appeared before the board. Hoff let the board know the City of Lisbon made a motion to allocate \$28,500 to the flex fund project the county was planning to do on 130th Ave and the Will's Road. The City of Lisbon wanted the \$28,500 to only go towards the sidewalk and possibly move it from the ditch to an easement between Hoffs and Kunze. The city is not opposed to phase two and would like to work together on the grant application.
