StormTRACKER Forecast

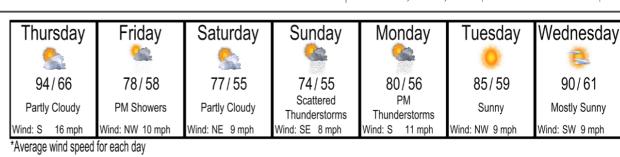
