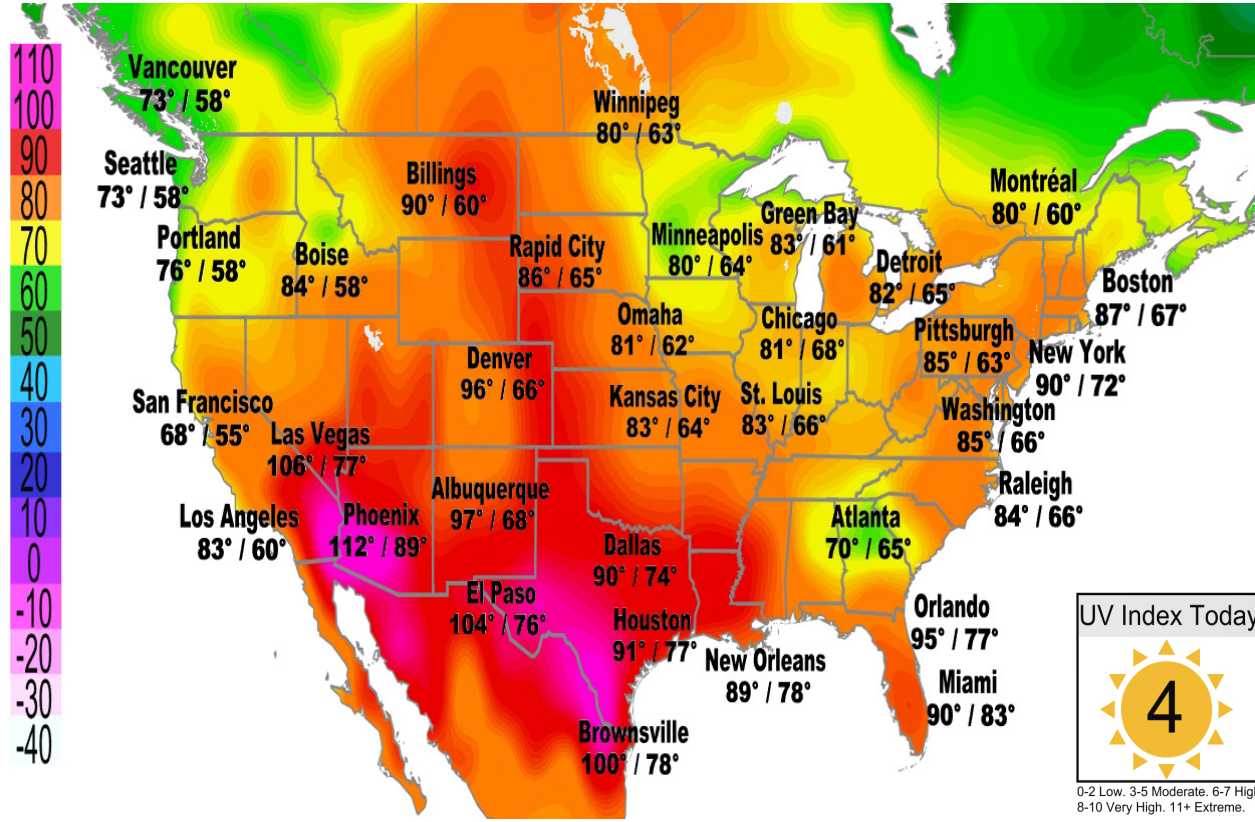
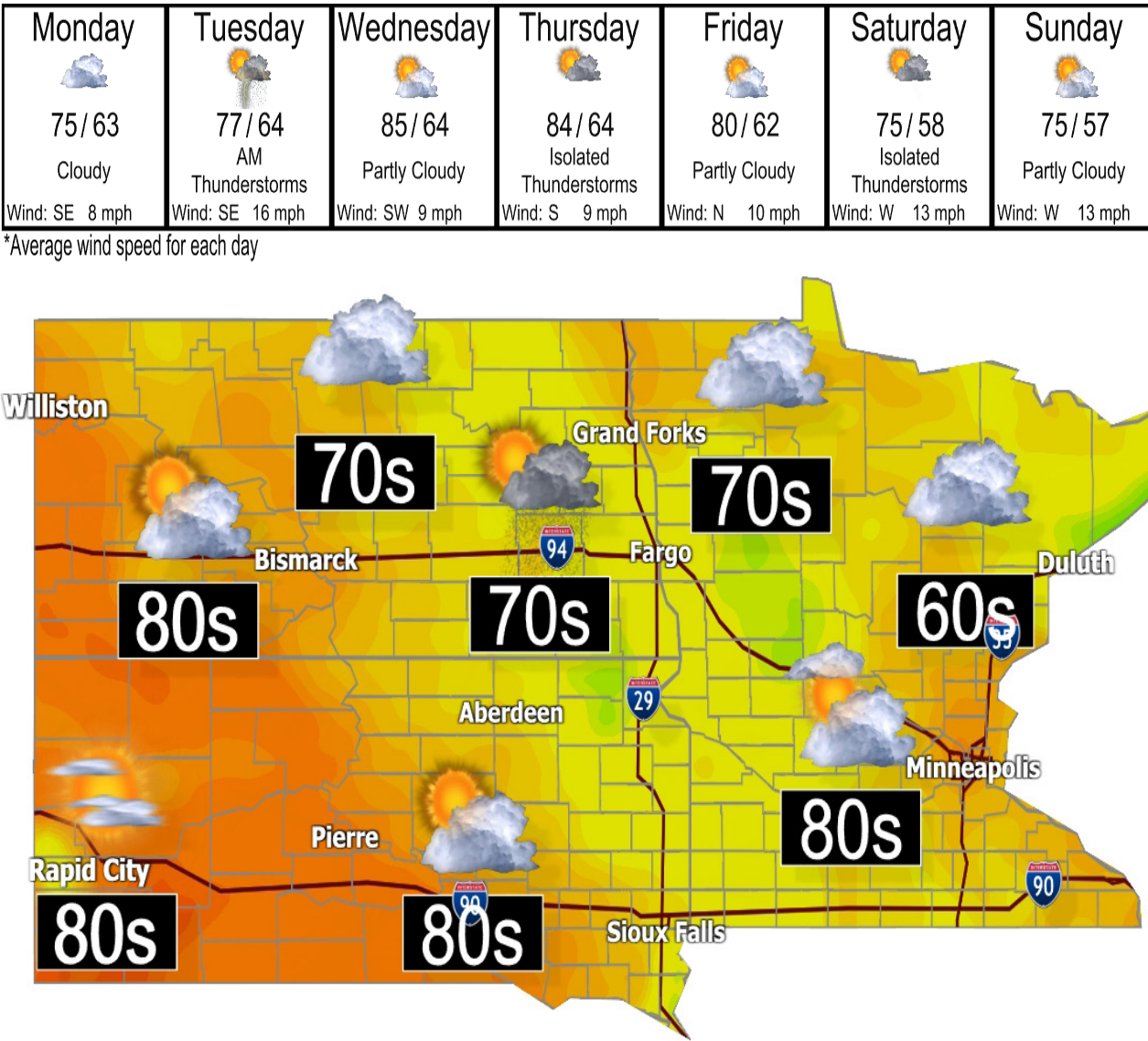

ND Emergency Services renames Homeland Security, State Radio departments

BISMARCK — The North Dakota Department of Emergency Services announced on Thursday, July 31, that it will rename two of its divisions, effective Friday. At the directive of House Bill 1079, which was introduced by the department and signed into law, the Homeland Security division will now be called the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management and the State Radio will be called the State Emergency Communications Center, according to a Thursday release. “The agency receives many calls regarding border missions, immigration problems, and foreign activity in the state; however, North Dakota Century Code provides minimal authority or direction for providing what is viewed by many as ‘homeland security.’ In addition, there is a risk of confusion for those seeking assistance before and after a natural disaster as they are not likely to correlate ‘homeland security’ with disaster assistance,” Homeland Security and Emergency Management Director Darin Hanson said in testimony. Changing the State Radio name to Emergency Communications Center reflects the technological capacity the division has gained, he said. Forum News Service

outside District 64 downtown, where a large crowd had gathered and bars were closing at the time of the shooting. “Due to the size of the crowd and the fact that individuals were becoming unruly, mutual aid was requested from surrounding law enforcement agencies to assist with scene control and ensure public safety,” said a Fargo police news release. The Cass County Sheriff’s Department, West Fargo Police Department, NDSU Police Department, the North Dakota Highway Patrol and Moorhead Police Department all provided assistance. Sunday evening, the city released statements from Fargo Mayor Tim Mahoney and Police Chief Dave Zibolski reacting to the shootings. Mahoney attempted to ease the minds of concerned citizens and made a plea for patience. “We all awoke this morning to shocking developments in Fargo. While we are assuredly shaken, I want to reiterate that Fargo is a safe community with a steadfast, dedicated and well-equipped police force that will tirelessly investigate these homicides,” Mahoney said. “I am asking for the public’s patience as FPD does its work by uncovering the facts and not the hype. Fargo remains a unified community that values safety, cares about one another and stands

together in trying times.” Zibolski said a substantial investigation into the shootings was active and ongoing. “A significant amount of work is underway to gather evidence, conduct interviews and determine the sequence of events that led to this incident. We understand the community wants answers, and we’re committed to doing the work needed. Our detectives are actively pursuing leads and gathering evidence,” Zibolski said.
