A 'Model Code' was purchased from the League of Cities. This can be used to help the city update its current ordinances. After review, the city will just add a couple of ordinances concerning moved in structures and set backs from property lines at this time.

An estimate was received from Dakota Concepts in the amount of \$23,985 to crack seal the streets Doug moved to accept the bid. Mike seconded. All in favor. MC

The city has 6 manholes that need to be raised. An estimate in the amount of \$5,181.24 was received from Metal and Earth Industries to do the repairs. Pete moved to approve with Dale seconding. All in favor. MC
