Paul Olson, Brodie Odegaard, Tim Schaffer, Sarah Karkuff, and Jared Moberg were present. James Falco with Williston Herald was present via audio.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

One addition was made to the agenda. Schmidt motioned and Peterson seconded to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Davidson motioned to approve the minutes from the previous meeting. Sundhagen seconded, motion carried unanimously.

The financial reports of all the funds were reviewed.
