 Board President Allmaras called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.

Approval of the Agenda
 It was moved by Alfstad and seconded by Schaefer to approve the agenda with the removal of Item B Fiscal Year 2025 Audit. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the March 9th, 2026 regular meeting and March 23rd, 2026 special meeting minutes

It was moved by Pfeiffer and seconded by Schaefer to approve the March 9th, 2026, regular meeting and March 23rd, 2026 special meeting minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the Consent Agenda

It was moved by Perleberg and seconded by Alfstad to approve the consent agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously. The consent agenda consisted of the business manager report, and the bills - general fund of \$35,979.05, the building fund of \$8,541.63, the food service fund of \$13,532.11, and the activity fund of \$7,393.30.

Monthly Committee Reports

Board member Alfstad spoke to the board about the building committee meeting that was held prior to the full board meeting. Highlights were a discussion of summer projects, and a motion for a RFP on the cafeteria roof, with hopes for work to be done this summer.

Principals' Reports

Secondary Principal Hager shared her report with the board. First semester '26-27 registration is complete. Hager reported on dual credit and NDCDE course registration numbers for the coming fall. Organization of the Accuplacer is complete as the test for students who need to take it will be administered within the next month. Classroom Observations

are complete with evaluations also near completion. Hager closed by going through a large list of secondary activities coming up in the next month, capped with Graduation on May 24th.

Elementary Principal Benz shared her report with the board. Students in grades 3-5 are participating in the NDA+ assessments, with grades K-2 ready to take them in the next month as well. Benz recently participated in the Leading for Literacy training in Fargo. SEEC put on the training that focused on aligning reading research with classroom practices. Reading month is underway with activities held in each classroom. Lastly Benz noted that the NESC completed a three part professional development series for all PK-12 teachers on explicit instruction. This training supports the districts focus on strengthening tier 1 instruction and aligning teacher practices with the science of reading.

Superintendent Report

Superintendent Becker shared her report with the board. Becker opened with noting a variety of seminars, conference calls, and trainings she participated in online or in person. Principal evaluations have been completed and filed. Becker noted to the board that summer school will not be held this summer. Limited enrollment, enrichment and data that does not support impacts on learning or retention are the primary factors. In closing Becker touched on the Human Trafficking legislation that has a policy on the agenda for tonight, as well as various upcoming meetings, trainings and events she will participate in, in the next few weeks.

Student Outcomes

Principals Hager and Benz presented to the board the results from the recent student engagement survey. Students in grades 3-12 are required to take the survey which provides them the opportunity to express their level of engagement with the school and its environment.

Policy GABE - Human Trafficking Policy

It was moved by Pfeiffer and seconded by Perleberg to approve the first and only reading of Policy GABE - Human Trafficking Policy per policy BDA. Motion carried by unanimous roll call vote. Policy is being mandated

through North Dakota legislation. Sessions will be held with selected classes, instructed by state selected groups this year to inform of the dangers of human trafficking.

Quarterly Review of Pledge of Securities

Item was realized after the approval of the agenda that full information had not yet been received from the Bank of North Dakota for this item. It will be placed and reviewed at the May meeting.
