LEAFY SPURGE COST SHARE AVAILABLE

The Renville County Weed Board will once again be offering a limited amount of funds available to cost share with landowners and operators in Renville County in the control of leafy spurge. In 2026 there will be a cost share program offered for this summer. This will be the traditional cost share program which is a two year program with each year application rates of 1 quart Tordon (or generic equivalent). The landowner's share of the cost share will include 20% of the cost of the Tordon (or generic equivalent), and the application. This must be documented and spraying completed by July 1, 2026.
