REGULAR MEETING OF THE MOHALL CITY COUNCIL
 3/9/2026
THE MOHALL PLAZA CONFERENCE ROOM/ SOLARIUM
 7:00 P.M.

The meeting was called to order with Mayor Witteman presiding at 7:00 PM. Roll call was taken.

PRESENT: Mayor Tom Witteman, Council Members John Nilsen, Mike Lamb, Alex Cook, Mike Duckett and Rick Haman. ABSENT: Dana McIntyre.

OTHERS IN ATTENDANCE: Chad Hassan and Justin Ahmann.

Recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moved by Haman and seconded by Lamb to approve the minutes of the Regular Council Meeting on February 9th, 2026. All voted "aye". None voted "nay". Motion carried.

Moved by Nilsen and seconded by Cook to add the CD maturity and renewal at Dakota West Credit Union to the agenda. All voted "aye". None voted "nay". Motion carried.

No Public Comment requests.

Certificate of Deposit (CD) Renewal: There are three CD's that will mature at Dakota West Credit Union before the April City Council meeting. Moved by Haman and seconded by Lamb to renew the three CD's at Dakota West Credit Union for a 13-month term at 3.40% interest or the best rate at the time of maturity for 13-months. All voted "aye". None voted "nay". Motion carried.

Mayor Witteman reported on general business of the city: Mayor Witteman reported that the city experienced another water main breaks on March 6 & 7. Described how the portion of town affected was isolated and repairs were made as soon as they could. Discussed the recent water breaks, the reasons and prevention. He also indicated that AAA Heating worked on the SE wing heating system at the Mohall Plaza.

Reviewed and discussed the February Sheriff's report.

Salary Review Committee report: The Salary Review Committee received a resignation letter from Chris Copeland, Public Works Department, with his final day being February 27, 2026. The committee has already advertised the position and has begun receiving applications, with the position posted as open until filled. This was brought before the council for formal acknowledgement and direction moving forward. Moved by Haman and seconded by Duckett to acknowledge the resignation of Chris Copeland from the Public Works Department, with his final day of employment being February 27, 2026, and authorize the Salary Review Committee to continue to accept applications and bring a hiring recommendation to the Council. All voted "aye". None voted "nay". Motion carried.

Public Works Certification Stipend Policy: The Salary Review Committee recommended the city provide a certification stipend for Public Works employees who hold and maintain the certifications required for operation of the City's water and wastewater system. The Certification stipend was recommended to be \$100 per month for the ND Class 1 Water Operator certification and \$100 per month for a ND Class 1 Wastewater Operator certification. The stipend will begin with the first full pay period following the council approval. The stipend will be paid through the city's regular payroll and be prorated per pay period. Employees receiving the stipend are responsible for maintaining the certification in good standing. Moved by Cook and seconded by Lamb to accept the Salary Review Committee recommendation for the stipend for the certified Public Works employee. All voted "aye". None voted "nay". Motion carried.

Hiring Process Authorization for the Public Works Department: The Salary Review Committee recommended that the City Council ratify the Salary Review Committee's action to advertise the position following the resignation of Chris Copeland, Public Works Dept., and authorize the Salary Review Committee to continue accepting applications and conduct interviews for the position, with the position remaining open until filled. The committee will bring a hiring recommendation to the City Council for approval, and the start date of the successful candidate will be determined by the Mayor and the Salary Review Committee. Moved by Duckett and seconded by Lamb to accept the recommendation of the committee's action to advertise the position, conduct interviews and bring a hiring recommendation to the council, with the start date of the successful candidate to be determined by the Mayor and committee. All voted "aye". None voted "nay". Motion carried.

Discussed Ordinance No. 2026-01, Floodplain Management. Moved by Lamb and seconded by Nilsen to approve the Second Reading of Ordinance 2026-01, Floodplain Management. By roll call vote: Council Members Nilsen, Lamb, Cook, Duckett and Haman voted "aye". None voted "nay". Motion carried.

Mohall Plaza Sprinkler Riser Repair: Discussed the proposal provided by Nova Fire Protection. No action was taken at this time.

Designated Emergency Fund use: Moved by Haman and seconded by Nilsen to designate the two recent water breaks as an emergency and allow the Emergency Fund to be used to help pay for the repairs. All voted "aye". None voted "nay". Motion carried.

First District Health Unit Campground Inspection: Moved by Lamb and seconded by Cook to continue to have the FDHU inspect the campgrounds. All voted "aye". None voted "nay". Motion carried.

Building Committee/Millennium Building: 8:00 pm Bid Opening. Moved by Cook and seconded by Duckett to allow Mayor Witteman to open the one submitted bid for the Millennium Building. All voted "aye". None voted "nay". Motion carried. Bid was open and submitted by Steve Hendershot for \$5000.00. No action was taken on the bid submitted.

Public Works Report: Chad reported that ND Rural Water has us on their schedule to start the sewer testing in late April if weather permits. Discussed the process of looking for a dump truck. Discussed the need to get continuing ed credits for the operator certifications. Discussed general Public Works business.

Justin Ahmann, Ackerman-Estvoid Engineering, report on general engineering business in the city. Justin addressed the cost share, DWSRF and the CWSRF applications and process. Discussed in length the Northwest Mohall Infrastructure Water, Sewer and Storm Sewer project. Justin informed the Council of the funding options and the specifics of the discussed project and provided the Engineer Contract for this project. Talked about adding sewer replacement to the six streets that were not mentioned on the plan and the need to continue the discussion of the project due to the probability of the water breaks in the area. After discussion, it was moved by Nilsen and seconded by Lamb to allow Mayor Witteman to sign the Engineer Agreement for the Northwest Mohall Infrastructure Water, Sewer and Storm Sewer project.

By roll call vote: Council Members Nilsen, Lamb, Cook, Duckett and Haman voted "aye". None voted "nay". Motion carried. Discussed the funding options for this type of project.

Moved by Cook and seconded by Duckett to pay the approved bills. By roll call vote: Council Members Nilsen, Lamb, Cook, Duckett and Cheryl Overby, City Auditor Tom Witteman, Mayor, Haman voted "aye". None voted "nay". Motion carried.
