DEER GUN	November 6 12:00 noon (CT) 16 1/2 Day Season	November 22	All units	Restricted to type of deer and unit described on license. Type of deer includes species and whether antlerless or antlered (at least one visible antler). Note exception for white-tailed deer hunters in units 4B, 4C, 4D and 4E. Orange clothing required.
MUZZLELOADER	November 27 12:00 noon (CT)	December 13	Statewide	Restricted to white-tailed deer only and type of deer described on license. No unit restrictions. Orange clothing required.
YOUTH DEER	September 18 12:00 noon (CT)	September 27	Statewide	11-, 12- and 13-year-olds - Any antlerless deer is legal. No unit restrictions. 14- and 15-year-olds - Any deer is legal. No unit restrictions. * Hunting units 4A-4F, a special license is required to hunt mule deer. These licenses are valid only in the unit specified on the license. Orange clothing required.
SPECIAL DEER-BOW HERD REDUCTION	September 4 12:00 noon (CT)	January 3	See Proclamation	Restricted to any-antlerless deer as described on license.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES FROM LAST YEAR

- The 2026 North Dakota deer hunting season is set with 39,100 licenses available, 3,200 less than last year.
- A total of 750 muzzleloader licenses will be available in 2026, 56 less than last year.
- A total of 240 nonresident any deer archery licenses available, 60 less than last year.

Barnes County Commission May 5, 2026 Valley City, ND 58072

The Barnes County Commission met in regular session on Tuesday, May 5, 2026, with Bill Carlblom, Mike Schwehr, Vicky Lovell, Pete Paulson, and Shawn Olauson present. Chairman Bill Carlblom called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m., roll call was taken, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited, and the agenda was reviewed.

Public Comments

No requests received.

City County Health District

Meghan Velure was introduced as the new director of City County Health District. Meghan was the acting director in the absence of Katie Beyer who resigned.

Sheriff's Office

SIRN radio antennas that we currently have do not communicate back and forth with the new radios. New antennas are \$916.40. One radio needs to be updated at a cost of \$1,532.12. Pete Paulson made a motion to approve the new antenna and radio purchase for a total of \$2,448.52; Shawn Olauson seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously with all members voting yes.

Environmental Services

Change orders for the HVAC process were discussed. PCO #1, is a time extension from October 1, 2026, to February 12, 2027, zero cost. This deadline is for the completion and finishing of walls etc. The HVAC will already be up and running. PCC 001, \$6,732.00 abatement of moving additional mechanical items from tunnel from this building to the jail. PCCO 02, controls deduct for occupancy sensors and added lighting in the basement ended up being a net credit of \$9,240.00. PCCO 003, \$50,699.00 plus PCCO 008, \$15,944.00 (steel) which totals \$66,643.00 of contingency funds, to reutilize and change the duct work to better use existing chases and existing openings, reducing the amount of structural cutting needed within the building. The steel number would be higher if this change isn't made. It also includes soffits coming out of the existing chases and an electrical item for the chiller. PCO 004 \$2,403.50 to adjust structural conduit that was in the way in the basement. PCO 009 is a credit of \$4,599.10 to do with the concrete finish of the enclosure of chiller, generator and transformer for ease of maintenance. The enclosure dimensions may change depending on dimensions of the generator that is purchased. Contingency funds needed now are \$61,989.50 which would leave a contingency fund balance of \$238,011.00. Shawn Olauson

made a motion to allow using the contingency funds needed for the current change orders; Mike Schwehr seconded the motion. Motion carried with all members voting yes.

Nathan Berseth

Josh Kasowski and Nathan Berseth, representing Bank Forward, appeared to discuss financing opportunities regarding the HVAC System for the courthouse. They will look at options and get back to us.

Auditor's Office

Mike Schwehr moved to approve April 26, 2026, minutes as presented. Pete Paulson seconded the motion. Motion carried upon roll call vote with all members voting yes. Barnes County Ministerial Association is seeking permission to hold the National Day of Prayer event on the Barnes County Courthouse lawn on May 7, 2026. Vicky Lovell made a motion to allow the Day of Prayer on the courthouse lawn; Mike Schwehr seconded the motion. Motion carried with all members voting yes. Wes Anderson's request to apply for a grant for a plaque designating the courthouse on the National Register of Historic Places was granted. The county will celebrate the 100th birthday of the Barnes County Courthouse with cake and ice cream during Community Days.

Commission Discussion

Pete Paulson stated the VSO will be advertising for a part-time van driver. 240 people came out for the Walking Taco Day during county government week. There have been campers camping at Faust Park and camping for a longer time than allowed. It is suggested to limit the camping days to two or three days. The Water Trail will supply a sign. Mike Schwehr reported CCHD is looking at hiring needs. Home Health has contracted a physical therapist and is becoming very busy. Vicky Lovell mentioned the SC-DRC funding programs and updates on other areas in their district. The library had carpets cleaned. They will be using some Carnegie funds to give away 250 books as prizes for the 250 anniversary years of the U.S. and will also be a part of Summer Nights on Central this summer. HUD will need to do landscaping work at the villa to move the smoking area from the east side to the west side. The food pantry at the Senior Center is doing well. They are short on ride funding dollars and looking for donations to lower the cost. The hotel in Hastings is being renovated. Bill Carlblom would like to say thank you to Ag Country, Handy Hardware and Dakota Plains for their donations to the Walking Taco Day. It is greatly appreciated. Thank you to everyone who helped. Heating system

bugs are being worked out.

FAA awards \$3.4 million to North Dakota airport terminal projects

WASHINGTON – Senator John Hoeven announced that the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) has awarded \$3.4 million in funding for three airport infrastructure projects across North Dakota through the Fiscal Year 2026 Airport Terminal Program (ATP). As a member of the Senate Transportation Appropriations Committee, Hoeven has secured funding to advance airport development projects and strong federal investments

in transportation infrastructure to benefit communities across North Dakota.

The funding will support the following projects:

- Rolla Municipal Airport – \$1.425 million – Reconstruct existing terminal building
- Bismarck Municipal Airport – \$1 million – Reconstruct and expand existing terminal building
- Hector International Airport (Fargo) – \$1 million – Install pas-

senger boarding bridges as part of terminal expansion project

“Modern, reliable airport infrastructure is essential for supporting commerce, connecting communities and improving travel across North Dakota,” said Hoeven. “These grants will help enhance terminal facilities in Rolla, Bismarck, and Fargo while ensuring these airports are better equipped to serve residents, businesses and visitors for years to come.”
